

NPT Meeting 26 September 2018

Barleycroft patrols - 41 patrols/actions made based on many earlier issues - no recent problems.

Military vehicles - several patrols mounted in London Road, reports made to intelligence group and key people at the base. There is apparent improvement but only over a limited period of observation. Need assessment by others. If vehicles are seen then they need to be collected up by SPC and forwarded as a list (not singly) to Tina - number, vehicle type, time, direction and place seen.

Lorry Watch - there are signs of some activity with some outcome expected, with low probability, within six months. It would be good to have in place with the idea being that trading standards would be informed of offenders recorded by the Lorry Watch team. 15 actions have taken place on B3083 so far.

Helpful ideas

Vulnerable people should dial 999 as opposed to 101 if they feel they are in danger or threatened by unwanted visitors.

People with red button alarms can use them for the co-ordinator to call the police in similar situation.

Warning of rogue traders - the vulnerable, in particular, should be advised. And if such activity is seen, that information needs to be shared.

Open Item

Mobility scooters come as "Road worthy" and those that are not. The former can be driven on roads and at half speed on pavements. Others are not supposed to be on roads. However, what can be used when there are no pavements? Issue raised but not resolved.
